ARRIVAL OF SPECIAL ADDITION WEIGHING 6 POUNDS 11 OUNCES ANNOUNCED BY DALLAS COUPLE

Arrival of a "special addition" of six pounds and eleven ounces at 10:45 p. m. Nov. 26, 1931, was announced officially by the publishers Barry Lee Bishop and Josephine Foester Bishop, who have set up temporary headquarters in Baylor Hospital of Dallas.

In commemoration of the event the addition was named Barry Louis Bishop, and Promotion Manager Dr. Howard S. Aronson announced that he expected Volume I to grow at the rate of about an ounce a day until further notice. Mr. and Mrs. Bishop said they would move back to their general headquarters at 926 Turner avenue about December 7.

The Dallas newcomer was named for both sides of the firm. Others interested in the project are the paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Bishop of Giddings; the maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis J. Foester of Port Lavaca, and the paternal great-grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Lee Riggs of Lexington.

Like Mahatma Gandhi, the future President is still in his swaddling clothes, and he is following the Indian patriot in having an authoritative voice about everything he is interested in. If he does not "choose to run" for President, Barry Louis said he would become the understudy of his father on The Dallas News.

In an interview, Barry Louis said at this time he is a confirmed Wet, but hoped that several years of education would change his beliefs. He closed by saying that everyone had been so nice to him, he would enjoy their company but requested no more remembrances of any kind except plenty of sleep.
