**Kappler -- Lehmann Nuptials Solemnized**



Miss Ruth Kappler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Kappler, and Mr. Roy Lehmann, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Lehmann, were united in holy matrimony on August 29th, at 6:30 p. m. in the St. Paul's Lutheran Church at Serbin. The Rev. A. Arndt performed the double-ring ceremony before a candlelit altar decorated with white asters and gladiolas and fern trees.

Mrs. Emmett Hannes played the traditional wedding music. She was accompanied by Miss Evelyn Hill who sang "O Perfect Love" and "The Lord's My Shepard."

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of white nylon tulle and lace over satin. It was fashioned with a lace bodice and a yoke of nylon tulle with an off-the-shoulder effect. The long sleeves came to points over her hands. The full skirt was of nylon tulle and panels of scalloped lace over satin which fell into a long train. The finger-tip veil of illusion fell from a heart shaped crown. She wore a pearl necklace, a gift of the groom, and a pair of pearl earrings, which were borrowed from a friend to complete the traditional wedding ensemble. Her bouquet was a purple orchid with lillies of the valley on a prayer book.

White tapers were placed on either side of the cake. Arrangements of white asters and gladiola completed the table decoration.
