

Weishuhn -- Lehmann Vows Are Exchanged In La Grange Rites on Sunday, June 12

The St. Paul Lutheran Church in La Grange was the scene of the marriage of Miss Marilyn Janice Weishuhn, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Weishuhn, and Edward Adolph Lehmann, son of Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Lehmann of Carmine, Sunday, June 12, at four o'clock, in the afternoon. Rev. H. T. Flachmeyer performed the double ring ceremony.

The church was decorated with white king asters and gladioli. Mrs. Elvis Meiners, organist, played nuptial music preceding the wedding and the traditional wedding marches. Mrs. Wilbert Jaster, soloist, sang "Because" and "Wedding Prayer."

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, was lovely in a chapel length, princess line gown of nylon tulle over candlelight satin. The full graceful skirt was ascended with Chantilly lace medallions embroidered with tiny seed pearls and iridescent sequins. The bodice of Chantilly lace featured a neckline accented with seed pearls and sequins. The lace sleeves came to a point over her hands and were fastened with tiny covered buttons. Her finger tip veil was held by a leaf designed bandeau of lace embroidered with seed pearls and sequins. Her only ornament was a strand of pearls with matching earrings, gift of the groom. She carried a white Bible covered with an orchid and white carnations.

The matron of honor, Mrs. Fred J. Wieder of Alvin, aunt of the bride, wore a bare top floor length formal of pink embroidered organdy. Frilly ruching topped the molded Empire bodice. She wore a tiny shrug jacket of matching organdy. The bouffant skirt consisted of three large embroidered ruffles. Her headdress was a tiny half hat of matching daisies. She carried a fan shaped bouquet of blue feather plumes and carnations.

The bridesmaids, Misses Loretta Ebner, Junell Pietsch and Waldine Schlabach, wore blue embroidered organdy dresses made identical to that of the matron of honor. They also wore half hats of matching daisies and carried fan shaped bouquets of pink feather plumes and carnations.

was a three tiered white confection topped with sugar rose carrying out the colors of the wedding. The cake was topped with an arch-way under which stood a miniature bride and groom. It was served by Mrs. Kenneth Lehmann and Mrs. Raymond Lehmann. Music throughout the reception was provided by the Village Boys.
