

Miss Schoenberg Weds at Carmine

Miss Willie Mae Schoenberg became the bride of Odell Lueckemeyer in a beautiful candlelight service in the Carmine Lutheran Church at 4:00 p. m. on Saturday afternoon, Dec. 8. The Rev. A. T. Kluge performed the double ring ceremony.

The bride is the daughter of Mrs. Will Schoenberg of Carmine and the groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Theo. Lueckemeyer of Brenham.

The church was decorated with baskets of white chrysanthemums and poinsettas. The four candelabra held white candles which were individually decorated with artificial poinsettas. Arrangements of white chrysanthemums were placed on the altar.

Mrs. W. F. Graeber played the traditional wedding music and also accompanied Miss Marilyn Graeber when she sang "Oh Perfect Love" and "Today, Oh Lord."

The bride, who was given in marriage by her brother-in-law, Nolan W. Schmidt, wore a gown of chantilly lace and tulle over satin, an original design by Miriam. It was created with a lace Spencer jacket featuring a small collar and long glove fitting sleeves forming a petal point over the hands. The bouffant waltz length skirt of lace revealed a pettiskirt of nylon tulle. Her veil of French illusion was held in place by a halo of lace adorned with seed pearls. She carried three camellias surrounded by carnations and velvet leaves.

Mrs. Elvis Kraus of Houston was her sister's matron of hon-

or. Doris Jean Ullrich of Carmine was the bridesmaid. They wore identical forest green dresses of antique taffeta. The dresses of ballarina length had short puffed sleeves and fitted bodices. The low rounded neckline was edged with a cord which came to a point in front. Their matching headpieces held a row of pearls. They carried colonial styled bouquets of white chrysanthemums.

T. W. Lueckemeyer served the groom as best man. Groomsman was Elvis Kraus of Houston, Melvin Henske and Charles Reichers Jr., both of Brenham, were the ushers.

A reception followed at the Carmine hall. A pork barbecue supper was served to about fif-

ty guests. The bride's table held the wedding cake which was in the shape of two large bells. At the top of the cake were two smaller bells tied with a white net ribbon. The cake was placed on a reflector encircled with lily of the valley and lace fern. Arrangements of white chrysanthemums were used as table decorations.

The bride's mother wore a black dress with black accessories and the groom's mother wore a grey dress with black accessories. Both wore pink carnation corsages.

For a wedding trip to New Orleans, the bride chose a blue faille suit with a brown bag and shoes. She wore a white velvet hat and brown and white striped gloves. Her corsage was of camellias.
