

Vows Repeated

At 8:00 o'clock on Tuesday night, August 31, Miss Jo Ann Mgebhoff, daughter of Rev. and Mrs. J. Fred Mgebhoff of Giddings, became the bride of Mr. John Clinton Hart, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Hart of Winchester, in a beautiful candlelight ceremony performed in the Martin Luther Lutheran Church here.

The Rev. J. Fred Mgebhoff, father of the bride, read the double ring ceremony before an altar decorated with white gladiola arrangements. Mrs. Emmett Hannes of Giddings, rendered the traditional wedding marches on the organ and accompanied the soloist, Mrs. August L. Wolff, of Giddings, in singing "O Perfect Love" and "The Lord's Prayer."
