*Koslan - Wachsmann Vows Exchanged*

The candlelight ceremony was performed by Rev. G. T. Naumann of Manheim before an altar decorated with gladioli and chrysanthemums.

Traditional wedding music was furnished by Teacher E. E. Heintze of Manheim, organist.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Koslan of Manheim and the bridegroom is the son of Herbert Wachsmann of Manheim.

The bride given in marriage by her father, was gowned in a wedding dress fashioned of chantilly lace and tulle over white satin. The fitted bodice of lace was cut in a point both front and back and the edge was finished in a hand rolled cord of lace. The low neckline was filled in with nylon illusion and the edge was finished with a small collar of lace. Iridescent sequins and seed pearls embroidered the collar, and long sleeves came to petal points over the hands.

The full skirt of lace, worn over crinolines, was bordered in a pleated flounce of tulle that extended down the back of the chapel length train.

Her fingertip veil of imported silk illusion fell from a lace cap embroidered in iridescent sequins and seed pearls.

The bride carried a small prayer book covered with satin and surrounded with carnations and lilies of the valley with ribbon streamers.
