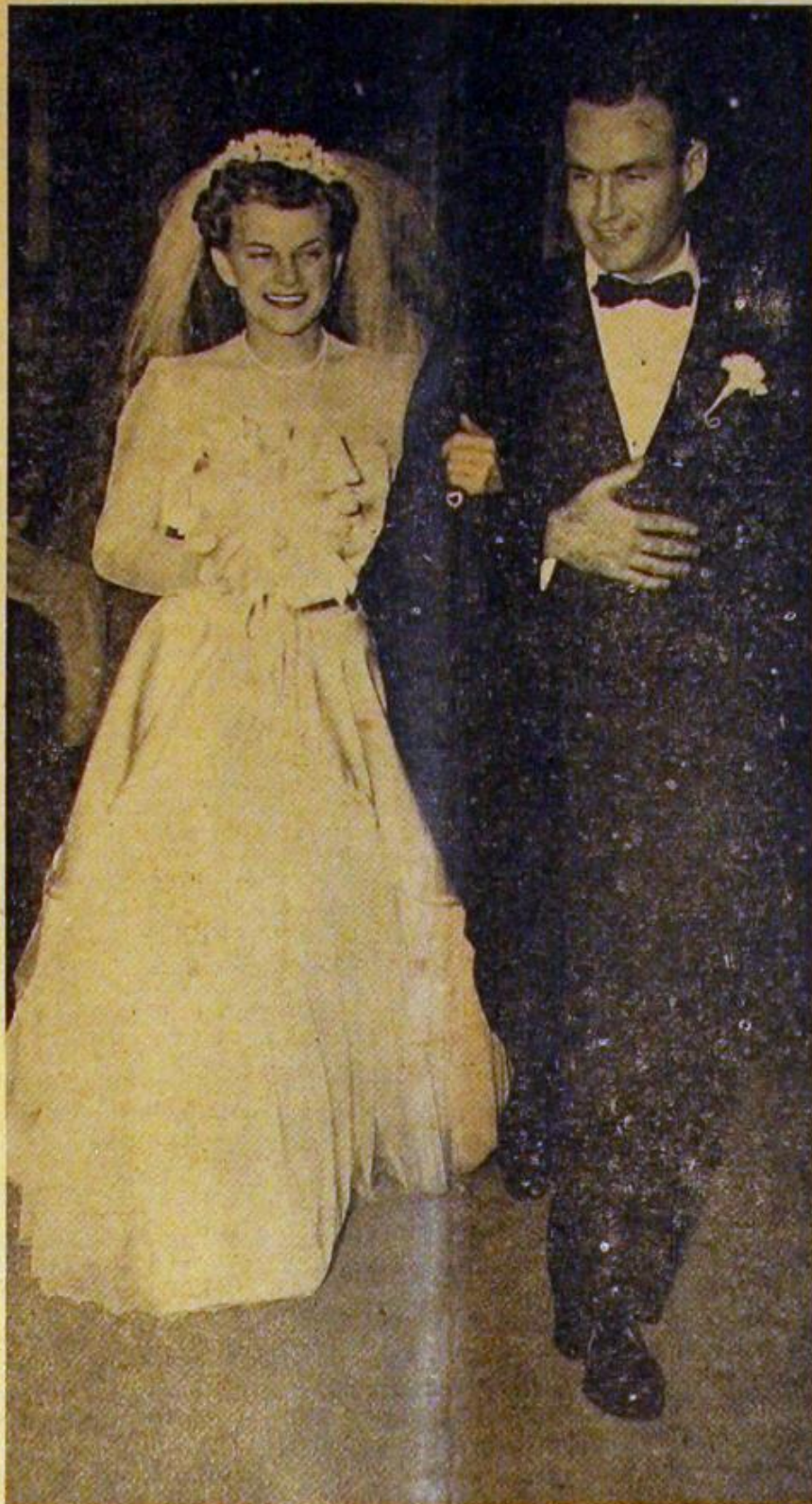


Take Marriage Vow Here Recently
