Sgt. Albert Edtmiller died in Germany June 6 of a fractured skull incurred in a motorcycle accident, his wife, Mrs. Bernice Edtmiller of Houston, has been advised.

Real cause of the accident is not yet known, but an investi-

gation is being made.

Sgt. Edimiller arrived from Germany March 30 to visit his father in Lancaster, Pa., and motored to Texas to spend several weeks with his wife and daughter. His wife and daughter returned to Pennsylvania with him to spend a few days with his father. They then accompanied him to Fort Dix and were with him until he sailed April 29. They planned to rejoin him in Germany as soon as the necessary arrangements could be made.

The body is being returned to Giddings, to be put into its final resting place. Funeral date has not yet been set

Sgt. Edtmiller had completed 12 years of army service, serving three years in Hawaii, six years in the states, and three years in Germany.
