## ***Lt. Hielscher Wounded In Action in Korea Area***

Second Lieutenant Dalton William Hielscher Sr. was wounded in action on December 1, 1950, in the Korean Area in the performance of his duty, his family was informed Sunday by a telegram signed by General C. B. Cates, Commandant of the United States Marine Corps.

The nature of his injury was not reported and the family was asked to stand by for further information. They were informed that delay in receipt of details must be anticipated.

Lt. Hielscher is a member of the Marine Corps and was

transferred to the war zone on Aug. 1, 1950. He joined the marines in 1938.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Hielscher of Rt. 3, Giddings.

Lt. Hielscher's wife, the former Miss Mary Winston of Herkimer, N. Y., is living in the latter city with their two children, a six-year-old son and a one-year-old daughter.

Lt. Hielscher is the first serviceman from this area reported wounded in the present conflict in Korea. His service address is First Provisional Casual Company, FMF Fleet Post Office, San Francisco, Calif.
