Cadet Alois J. Jaeger, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Jaeger of Giddings, is currently attending Reserve Officers' Training Corps Summer Camp at the Army's Antiaircraft Artitlery and Guided Missile Center near El Paso, Texas,

Cadet Jaeger, a student at A & M College of Texas is one of 1,460 senior ROTC cadets from sixty-four colleges, and universities in the united States enrolled in the sixweek summer antiaircraft artillery training course.

Training in the encampment is organized to give practical, field-type experience in all phases of antiaircraft artillery. The cadets put into practice many of the subjects studied in the college class rooms during their academic year.

At the climax of their training, every cadet will fire the 90mm AA cannons at high altitude targets, and the light 40mm and 50 caliber guns at lower flying aerial targets.

At the completion of the summer training period, eighty-five cadets who have already graduated from college, will receive commissions in the Army Reserve as Second Lieutenants.

Final ceremonies of the camp will close the training period July 30. Cadets will depart the West Texas post July 31.
