Lengthy Trip by Auto

W. A. Jaehne, Allan Cherry and Wm. Dungan returned Saturday from an auto trip to Denver, Colorado and other points. The boys left Giddings the morning of July 4th and traveled in all between 3500 and 4000 miles. They saw many of the interesting sightseeing places of Colorado and "Bill" drove his car to the top of Pikes Peak and down without any mishap. They report the changing weather while ascending the mountain, the falling snow and the red hot stove at the top are novel experiences. They had no car trouble on the entire trip except that they were bumped by a truck at one place, which cost the other fellow about \$20 and delayed them some. They left here with new casings and besides a few punctures enroute, had no tire trouble. They camped out every night. One night they awoke about midnight and put on some more clothes because they were cold—they were sleeping and covered with three blankets, but that was not enough. The entire expenses of the trip for each of the three was \$100.
